The “**Popular Software Tools**” course offers video tutorials on the following Microsoft products: **Access, Excel, Outlook, PowerPoint, Project, Publisher, SharePoint Designer, Visio, and Word**. ***Different level tutorials are available for beginner, intermediate, and advanced learners.*** The instructional resources are available for the most recent updates, as well as past editions of Office products. Some resources for Mac editions of Office are also offered.



The “**Get Started with the Internet**” course offers the following video tutorials: “Communicating with the Internet,” “What is the Internet,” “Surfing the Internet,” and “The Internet as a Search Tool.” This resource is great for users who want to learn how to send emails or search for information on the Internet.



The “**Get Started with Your Computer**” course offers the following video tutorials: “Getting to Know your Computer,” “Using your Desktop Applications,” and “Computer Safety and Maintenance.” This is a great place to begin for people who are new to computers.

Registering with Learning Express

You will be prompted to enter your 14-digit library card number and your 4-digit PIN. If forgotten, your PIN can only be requested in person at the library.

Once you arrive at the Learning Express homepage, make sure to log-in or register an account.

The "login" and "register" links are in the top right corner of the homepage. You will need an email account in order to register an account.

TIP: write down the email account and password you used, so that you can access your saved progress with Learning Express.

After clicking the "Computer Skills" link, you must scroll through the different class options and select the computer skill you want to learn.




Navigating the Courses


Select a course, such as "Popular Software Tools."
