Introductions	Library updates - Round Robin	<ul> <li>Topic this month: "What business questions are being asked? Are patrons asking about start-ups or scale-ups? Are they targeting certain kinds of businesses and business needs? Are they using your meeting rooms?</li> <li>This month's topic is generated through the IS team's increasing efforts to connect with entrepreneurs. Additionally, Alta Porterfield was selected to represent Delaware at the upcoming Career Development Facilitator Training in January 2015.</li> <li>Discussion: Some libraries reported that questions have to do with starting a business (consulting, clothing store, pizza shop, or hair salon, for examples) or non-profit. Questions stem from how to fund a start-up, such as if there are any grants for a non-profit. Wilmington Library added that they use NOLO's resources to help with business/legal questions.</li> <li>ACA/Choose Health Delaware medical insurance coverage for small businesses is also commonly asked.</li> </ul>

		DTCC-Owens mentioned that they have an entrepreneurship group that meets each fall (non-credit). This year, it was a person who wants to brew Mead. It seems to many library staff that patrons are not asking reference librarians directly for help, but come when stuck on part of their research to start a business. It may be helpful for us to know how many 'how to start a business' books are being checked out, if Ebsco is used for this, and if the LibGuide on Entrepreneurship is commonly used. Regarding meeting room use for small business/entrepreneurs: Some libraries do not allow for-profit businesses access to large rooms, or charge for use of their meeting rooms. Typically, the meeting rooms/study rooms are intended for non-profits and civic groups, though tutoring is commonly held in study rooms. One library mentioned that it would not work well to allow a person to meet with clients, conduct business, etc. since the meeting room is not private or soundproof and voices carried. (They had trouble with this in the past.) Finally, there was mention that a kind of civil engineer was asking a library to print out 3D pieces for a structure he was putting together as a kind of presentation or job proposal.
