

Real Action Leading to Results

OBJECTIVE

 To provide information on United Way of Delaware Get Delaware Reading Literacy Initiatives.

WHY THIS WORK IS IMPORTANT

- In middle-income neighborhoods the ratio of books per child is 13 to 1, in low-income neighborhoods, the ratio is 1 age-appropriate book for every 300 children.
- 2/3 of students who cannot read proficiently by the end of 4th grade will likely end up in jail or on welfare. Over 70% of America's inmates cannot read above a 4th grade level. ref. 2 »
- Those who don't read proficiently by the 3rd grade are 4 times likely to drop out of school. ref. 3 »
- 80% of preschool and after-school programs serving low-income populations have no age-appropriate books for their children.
- <u>Children from lower-income homes have limited access to books</u>. Because of this, there are fewer
 home and preschool language and literacy opportunities for preschoolers from low-income families
 than children from economically advantaged backgrounds.

GET DELAWARE READING

The Get Delaware Reading Initiative focuses on promoting early literacy and school readiness through quality teaching, reducing chronic absence, and improving summer learning. Additionally, the program endeavors to engage parents as their children's first teachers. The program seeks to support the state's goal of all student reading on or above grade level by third grade.

NEMOURS BRIGHT START

- Nemours BrightStart! (NBS!) The Complete Program for Early Literacy Success is the only proactive early literacy program developed by a child health organization to improve reading and health outcomes for struggling or emergent readers beginning in the preschool years. The 20-lesson program puts educators at the forefront of early literacy best practices with an exciting multisensory approach to building reading readiness skills. The strategy-based design format provides educators with well-researched strategies and foundational best practices that promote oral language, print awareness, letter knowledge, phonological awareness, emergent writing, and comprehension skills. The NBS! Complete Program for Early Literacy Success: Level One contains the following:
- 20 Lesson Plans with corresponding materials (Lesson Plans Can Be Adjusted)
- 200+ early literacy activities
- Teacher's Guide Read Aloud Book Set (16 high-quality children's books)
- Family Connection (parent letters in English and Spanish)
- Adaptive and Accelerated Strategies for diverse learners
- Skill Development Checklists for progress monitoring
- Sensory Manipulatives Kit (Gel Writing Boards, Magnetic Whiteboards, Magnifying Glasses, Magnetic Letters, Music CDs, Puppets, and more

BOOK NOOK INITIATIVE

BookNook provides guided literacy sessions for small groups of 2-6 students with a Reading Guide/Teacher. Guides run the BookNook lesson from a device such as a laptop or Chromebook.

Students will be on their own Chromebook or other device and participate in fun and engaging activities in phonics, fluency, comprehension, and more.

MY VERY OWN LIBRARY

The MVOL program is a collective effort to spark and foster a love for reading and improve literacy test scores among participating school students throughout the state of Delaware. The program is convened by the United Way of Delaware, and supported by University of Chicago and Scholastic.

- Working with outside literacy organizations and well as with in our MVOL continuum to create Reading Book Challenges and literacy activities


