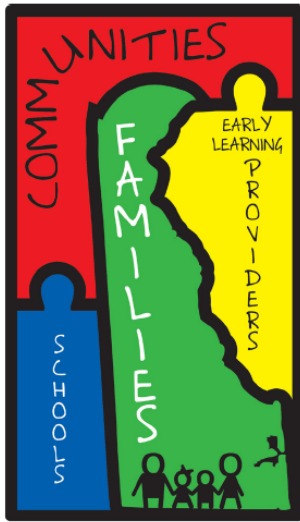

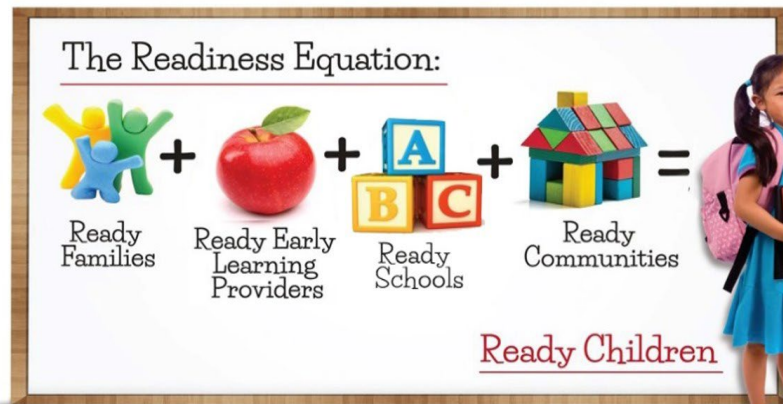

REGISTRATION STEPS

- 1** Gather your registration documents (create electronic files)
- 2** Go to registration website: <https://education.delaware.gov/families/k12/enroll-in-public-school/>
- 3** Scroll down to the registration Section- Click icon "Register for Public School"
- 4** Click on Create an Account Page
- 5** Complete online registration
- 6** Complete the feedback survey
- 7** Talk with your child to get them excited about kindergarten

ITEMS TO GATHER FOR REGISTRATION

ORIGINAL BIRTH CERTIFICATE

Office of Vital Statistics:

- New Castle County 302-283-7130
- Sussex County 302-856-5495

PROOF OF RESIDENCY

Ask your school for its specific list of what will serve as proof of residency and gather those documents.

PROOF OF PHYSICAL EXAM

As required in Delaware Education Health and Safety regulations:

At your child's 5-year-old well visit, ask your doctor to complete a "Delaware General Physical Form"

OR

Call your child's doctor to schedule a physical exam. Take the physical exam form included in your school registration information and ask for a completed form to provide to the school. Be sure to schedule immunizations, a lead test, and a Tuberculosis test during your child's physical exam.

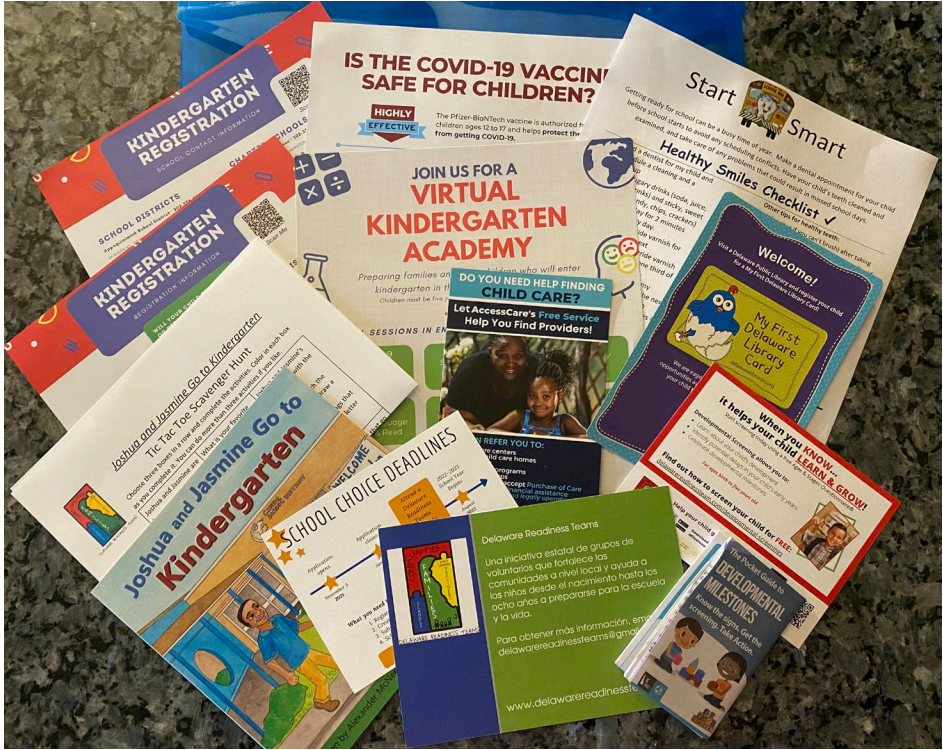
HEALTH RECORDS

As required in Delaware Education Health and Safety regulations:

- Proof of immunizations
- Proof of a Physical Exam
- Proof of Tuberculosis Screening
- Proof of Lead Test


Create electronic files of documents using any of the following (DOC, DOCX, PDF, TXT, RTF, XLS, XLSX, BMP, GIF, JPG, JPEG, PNG)

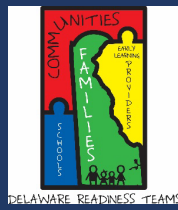

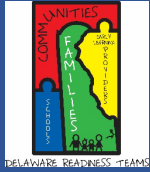

Developmental Screening History

Prior to 2013:

- DE's screening rates were one of the lowest in the country.
- Most districts were using the DIAL screening
- Screenings were completed by screening teams on paper
- No statewide system existed to collect results or recommendations
- Little or no communication between state agencies regarding screening

2018

Screening only available in some locations

- Four & Five Star QRIS Child Care Programs
- Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems Grant catchment areas (Wilmington and Sussex)
- 1 School District

2019

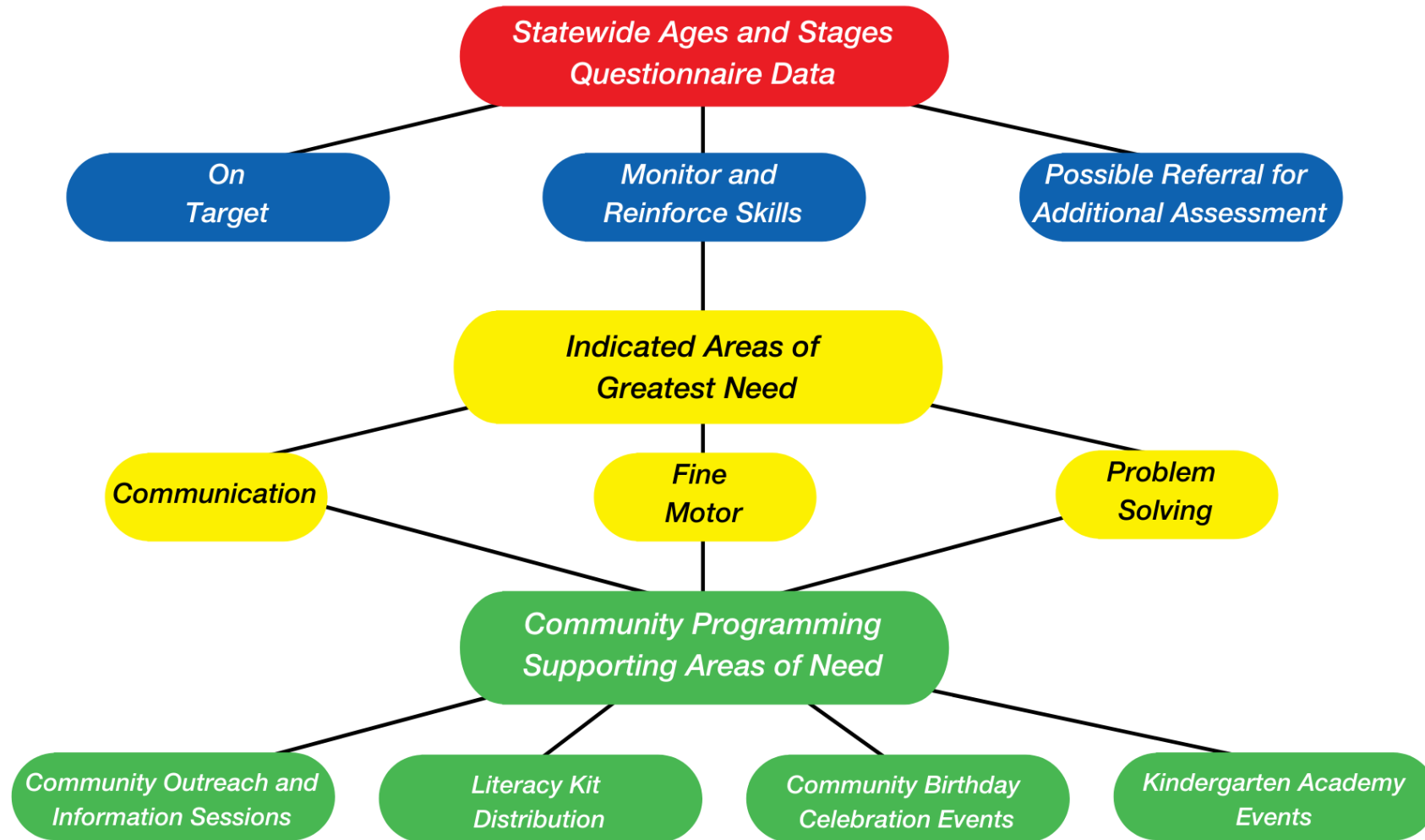
- Highmark Blueprints Grant
- Organized where and how to success developmental screening.
- Created a website page and developmental screening outreach materials for families.
- Opened ASQ portal for anyone else who did not have access.

2023

- All families have access to online ASQ developmental and Social Emotional Screeners.
- One data tracking system for all ASQ's
- All licensed childcare programs will require children get screened yearly.

Institute for Public Health Innovation provides a core 16-hour training on Healthy and Equitable Communities. The curriculum includes content focused on root causes of inequities and strategies for addressing social determinants of health; equity, diversity, and inclusion; community participation and power dynamics; communicating equity to stakeholders; and developing equitable strategies focused on policy, system, and environmental changes.

Currently, the workshop is broken into 4, 4-hour Zoom sessions spread out over 2-4 weeks and using didactic and interactive components guided by adult learning theory. Sessions will also examine DRT outreach through an equity lens.
