- New school libraries in catalog (WorkFlows)
  - o Capital School District schools. High school will participate in transit starting in October 2024.
  - Ferris School Library DCSYFFER libraries in Wilmington campus.
  - None in transit yet, so shouldn't come up on holds report.
  - Upcoming database freeze due to deduplication scheduled this month. Clean up to merge duplicate titles into a single record.
  - Upgrade to Symphony (WorkFlows) from 3.70 to 4.0, and web services upgrades coming in next few months.
  - Internal document with updates will be shared as soon as it is finalized.
  - Tabs working again in DLC to display details of items with NoveList & Syndetics information.
  - Talpa.ai search feature on TEST catalog site. Please check it out! (Please do not share the TEST catalog link with patrons). Another new AI tool SirsiDynix is working on is a disambiguation tool to guide searches.
  - Also on the TEST catalog Interlibrary loan form separate from Item Recommendation form. Still on the fence whether two separate forms are needed. Feel free to use and submit, but please add "TEST" somewhere in the form since it does go to Ask a Librarian. Please send any thoughts on having the separate form to the DLC Team (dlc@lib.de.us)
  - Question regarding catalog records for Teen Fiction books that are in school libraries are just set up as Fiction. More discussions to explore uniformity in cataloguing materials and reduce redundancy.

  last seven days of each calendar month, patrons will be able to choose from a selection of TV
  shows, movies, comics and manga, eBooks, and audiobooks without using their

  - Audrey had a question about the Delaware Libraries hoopla collection yes, there are some eAudiobook titles that are not included (approximately 40,325 blocked due to the price cap of \$2.84 out of 1.59 million titles in hoopla! One BingePass is also blocked due to the price cap).
